

City & Guilds Level 2 Award – Sit-in and sit-astride all-terrain vehicles (ATV) handling

Overview

This course aims to provide the learned with the knowledge, skills and understanding to ride or drive their ATV safely in the work place. The qualification covers pre-use checks, instrument and control recognition, safe driving and maneuvering the vehicle on various types of terrain including slopes.

Course Content

- Hazards specific to the site, task & machine
- ATV functions and controls
- Pre-use checks to the ATV
- Legal and safety requirements
- Factors to be considered when operating an ATV on various terrain
- Cleaning and inspection of the ATV
- Operate an ATV that is laden, has an implement attached on various terrain
- Operate an ATV with a trailer or trailed implement attached including reversing.

Course Requirements

You are required to provide your own Tools & Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for this training course.

ATV vehicle must comply with the Department of Transport and Road Traffic Acts where relevant with manufacturers book/operators manual. Equipment must comply with the relevant requirements of PUWER 1998.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):

- Suitable head protection must be worn, eg a motorcycle helmet which meets BS 6658, or an ATV helmet/other head protection which meets BS EN 1384: 1997.
- Eye protection (a visor or safety glasses to EN 166), against flying insects, dust or branches.
- Protective boots with good grip and ankle support (complying with EN 345-1), when loading or unloading the AT V.
- Gloves, for loading and unloading.
- Non-snag outer clothing. The use of high-visibility clothing may also be appropriate.
- We also recommend you dress appropriately for weather conditions.
